








### Inequality in G7 Countries Source: Tóth




#### Rising Inequality has been a general Rich Country Phenomenon

Changes in Gini indexes, mid-1980s-late 2000s, select OECD countries. Source: Tóth








#### All Countries Redistribute Income

- Equality

- Identity
