Getting around the city

- Liverpool is not a huge city, so walking to most parts of the city is feasible.
- There is some information from Liverpool City Council regarding getting around the city [here](#). They have information on taxi ranks, local transport etc.
 - Hackney taxis, or "black cabs" can be hailed from the street, as long as they have their taxi light on.
 - Uber is also available in Liverpool.

- Liverpool Lime Street station is the main train station within Liverpool. This station has links to the national rail network and is located in the heart of the city centre.

- Most international attendees will most likely fly into Manchester Airport, as this is the largest airport near Liverpool <https://www.manchesterairport.co.uk/>.
 - Manchester Airport is approximately 1 hour drive from Liverpool, and a taxi costs from £60 upwards depending on various factors. Uber is available, as are “black cabs” which require no booking and can be picked up outside of all terminals from the taxi rank. Onward Travel Solutions <https://ots-uk.co.uk/> is a company that can be used to pre-book airport taxis, they have been reliable in the past.

Other considerations

The weather

- The British are famous for constantly discussing the weather and with good reason, as the weather can vary quite a bit in the UK. However, June in the UK is the height of summer so will more than likely be sunny weather (but not guaranteed!)
 - Average high temperature in June is 18°C
 - Average low temperature in June is 11°C
 - Rain does happen in the height of summer in the UK, so we would recommend either a light raincoat or umbrella to be safe!
 - Sunrise will be around 04:45am, with sunset around 21:40 local time.
