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
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INTRODUCTION





STARS is testing screening tools and a tiered service model by providing targeted resources focused on child development, parent mental health and psychosocial needs. STARS targets low-socioeconomic families who experience multiple barriers to accessing timely support.



CO-DESIGN

Substantial community engagement and co-design was undertaken in 2023-2024. This has shaped the STARS model design to ensure it is appropriate and acceptable in local communities.


METHODS

STARS is an Australian multi-site trial.

In WA, a tiered model will be tested digitally. Families with young children (6m to 3y) will complete surveys about their family's health and wellbeing, then will be classified into 1 to 3 tiers. Families with minor concerns will be connected



to digital resources that support self-directed early intervention care. Families with more significant concerns will receive targeted referral-based assistance. A control group will be given basic general information.



AIMS

STARS aims to identify and support developmental challenges in young children to optimise their lifelong potential. Beyond early childhood identification and intervention, the model is expected to enhance family psychosocial wellbeing and parent mental health through tailored and accessible supports.



FUNDING: STARS is funded by the Australian Medical Research Futures Fund and supported through the ORIGINS cohort based at the Kids Research Institute Australia
